- 5. Planning Applications
 - a) DCC/4385/2024 Kilmington Primary School, Whitford Road, Kilmington EX13 7RG

Demolition of the Devon Lady, single storey classroom at Kilmington primary school and construction of a modern equivalent of the same dimensions

Cllr. Seward proposed that the Parish Council support this planning application but that the following comments be considered:- Access to the site off the Whitford Road is on a hill and a bend which has limited visibility. Entry into the site is via a narrow lane which has a sharp right angle turning. We therefore ask that delivery and contractors vehicles are appropriately sized, and safety controls are put in place to help prevent road accidents and damage to neighbouring property.

Seconded by Cllr. Dare, all in favour.

b) Ref. No. 24/0261/FUL - The Oaks Shute Road Kilmington EX13 7ST

Proposal for side extension (resubmission based on 23/1107/FUL)

Cllr. Veberth proposed that the Parish Council had no objection to this planning application, seconded by Cllr. Reed, all in favour.

The Clerk reported that since he had submitted the reactivation form to Santander he had not received anything from them and that no monies had been transferred to the Lloyds account. Cllr Dare said he would contact Santander

Cllr. Ball advised that Cllr. Seward, the Clerk and himself had a recent online Teams call with the EDDC Section 106 officer. Cllr. Ball gave a report of the matters raised and discussed and said that they had learned a lot of information on the Section 106 agreements and available monies applicable to Kilmington and also as regards CIL.

It had been a very useful meeting but further investigation and discussions would be needed to fully explore and understand how the Parish Council can best access and utilise the Section 106 and CIL monies for the benefit of the Parish and Parishioners.

d) Highways Matters

1) 30 to 20 mph Speed limit

Cllr. Ball said that the Parish Council had paid for the survey and design work which had been caried out and that the next stages to complete the 20mph project would be the necessary legal work and then the required signage installation works. Devon Highways had quoted £3,000 for the legal work and £12,300 for the signage installation.

Cllr. Seward proposed that the Parish Council pay DCC £3,000 for the legal work to be carried out. Whilst this legal work was being carried out the Parish council could explore how the signage work could be funded and in particular further explore the possibility of utilising Section 106 monies for this purpose. Seconded by Cllr. Veberth, all in favour.

Cllr. Ball to contact DCC Highways to notify them that we wish to proceed with the legal work and request an invoice.

Cllr. Ball would also speak to Highways about the 2024 trenche of 30 to 20 applications to be considered and that the Parish Council wish to amend it's application to show that it was only applying for the cost of the £12,300 signage installation costs.

Cllr. Seward advised that the Speed Watch Team had carried out one speed watch session but that unfortunately the other planned sessions had to be postponed due to adverse weather.

Cllr. Ball reported that the Listed Building Application had been approved by EDDC but that the brewery had now queried the exact location of where the

defibrillator should be located. He was hoping that this could be quickly resolved and the defibrillator be installed and made operational.

He advised that the Awareness training session was held in the Cricket Pavilion on the 16th January 2024 and had been well attended.
